> Two weeks passed. Beverly asked Village Arts V.P. Patti Crichton if she would put a notice in Inside Leisure Village, which she did. Five days after the October issue arrived, Beverly's painting reappeared in the library in front of the fireplace. Patti called her. "It's back!" she said.

> There are no answers to who "borrowed" the painting which, like the other paintings hung in the library, are meant to be appreciated and untouched. Beverly's New Hampshire scene is safely back on her wall. It makes her smile, she says, because "No one ever said they loved it before. "I'm glad it's home with me."



Bill was appointed Galileo Project Manager a few months after the October 18, 1989 launch. He was Chief of Navigation for the first orbiter (1971) and first landers (1976) on Mars. He continued with other JPL projects including an appointment as Chief Technologist for the Mars Exploration Program. He was honored with the NASA Distinguished Service Medal for his management of Project Galileo.

Bill and his wife of 63 years, Diane, raised their family of 3 children, Phillip, Christine, and Gregory in the San Gabriel Valley cities of Sierra Madre, Pasadena and Arcadia. In 2007, they moved to the Central Coast town of Atascadero and in 2019, to Leisure Village. Their home is in Village 37, son Phillip lives in Village 38.

Collecting cars became one of Bill's hobbies. Like his engineering career, he would carry this passion to reaching for the stars, collecting ground-breaking vehicles that would bring awards and accolades in the classic car community. His current collection is an impressive

LV's New Spectrum Service

It's not often that a story in (200/10 MBPS), a modem and ILV affects every person in the Village. But this is one of a rare breed. Spectrum, or as it calls itself "Spectrum Community Solutions," is bringing upgraded internet and television services to Leisure Village in the upcoming months, the result of a new contract with Leisure Village Association. The upgrades should be completed in early 2022, according to Spectrum.

Spectrum calls the new services "a significant enhancement" to what it has provided in Leisure Village. The changes will focus on improving the infrastructure - the equipment and technology that bring the internet, television, movies, On Demand and music channels into LV homes. Spectrum also reports that residents can expect a lower monthly charge for those services.

By the new agreement between Spectrum and Leisure Village Association, the upgrades will provide residents with Spectrum internet a router, unlimited bandwidth, access to 274 TV channels, highdefinition service, HBO and HBO Max and two DVR boxes. According to the company, the basic charge to a household will total an estimated \$56 a month. Currently, the average monthly Spectrum bill is about \$83.

The new five-year contract includes major upgrading to the Spectrum equipment below ground that is marked by the large white nodes above ground at 14 locations around the Village. Villagers won't see any changes to their home service until that work is completed, perhaps before the end of this year.

Spectrum's Christopher Attalla says that a customized letter will go out to each Village customer before the upgraded service begins, itemizing what services will be provided and what it will cost. He also adds that residents will be free to choose to opt out.

How Changes to Architectural Permit Process Affects You

Our team stays actively engaged in Leisure Village by contributing time and effort through serving on committees. Serving on the Architectural Committee is one of the ways we keep up with the rules, regulations and activities regarding home improvement on Village homes. There have been a few changes to the committee that affect all of us as homeowners and some of the transactions we engage in as Realtors.

One of the most significant changes is the removal of an approved contractors list for homeowners who want to do work that requires an architectural permit. These permits are required for basically everything that affects the outside of the home. Being able to choose contractors from any resource comes with a set

of responsibilities to the homeowner including:

Read carefully and understand the parameters of your proposed job by reading the Architectural Committee Guidelines in the handout that is available at the Association Office located near the West Gate.

Communicate with your contractor and make sure he sees and understands the guidelines as listed in the handout. If questions arise, contact Michelle Solarzano at the Association Office for clarification. She can be reached at 805-484-2861 ext 222.

Choose a contractor with job-appropriate California State Licensing, bonding and insurance. Have the contractor prepare

Serotonin is a neurotransmitter in the brain that is the key to mood regulation, pain perception and gastrointestinal function, including perception of hunger and satiety and other physical functions. Low Serotonin can cause:

Depression, especially in women Anxiety

Craving sweets and starches Insomnia

Increased pain sensitivity

We are fortunate to have the LVA take care of the Village, but that excludes the inside of our home. The fact is that most accidents occur within the home. Since the bathroom is usually the most dangerous room in the home, here are some simple steps that you can take:

Do you have grab bars installed that meet your needs (not the last residents'). A raised toilet seat can decrease the distance traveled, and retractable bars on both sides of the toilet help you rise safely. Be sure to include a folding bath bench.

Now let's move to the kitchen, you're getting ready to cook dinner and you take a block of cheese out of the fridge that has blue marks on it and it's not English Stilton; is it ok to eat? A jar of salt-free vegetable juice presented itself in the cabinet and shouted, "Hey, you, I'm about to expire." OK, the question to ask



A WORD ON WINE By Don & Barbara Senior

Corkage – A Fancy Term for BYO Wine... with etiquette, of course

you bring your own wine to a restaurant. You might be looking to pair a particular wine with a menu item, or you may want to bring a special bottle. It could be a well-aged bottle from your collection, a boutique brand or an uncommon varietal. Corkage at Camarillo's Manhattan, Bistro13 and Lucerne restaurants is \$15 per bottle, which is typical. High-end restaurants with extensive wine lists usually have higher fees. Occasionally, corkage is the price of a restaurant's least expensive wine.

Corkage is paid to the restaurant, not the server. It is intended to compensate for several things. The most obvious is accommodations for serving the wine - removing the cork and providing glassware. The restaurateur loses revenue if wine is not purchased from the restaurant. Finally, there's the restaurant's investment in their own wine program, including curating a wine list, possibly having a staff sommelier and training staff on their wine.


own wine is a courtesy, and there is some etiquette. Know if they allow corkage and find out what the fee is. Never bring a bottle of wine that is on the restaurant's wine list. If you

A corkage fee is charged when are unsure of anything, call ahead. In any case, bring a bottle valued at more than the corkage fee.

> Don and I don't often bring our own wine when dining out, but sometimes it's the best alternative. The elegant Ahwahnee dining room in Yosemite charges \$40 corkage. We brought a nicelyaged boutique wine to dinner and gladly paid the fee. We lived in the small town of Oakhurst, CA before moving to the Village and often brought wine to a favorite restaurant with a limited wine list. We never brought wine to Erna's Elderberry House, also in Oakhurst. Erna's is a high-end restaurant with fixed menu, fivecourse dinners. Their wine list is massive, curated by a talented sommelier, and wine pairings are offered with each course of the daily prixe fixe menu. The pairings were always our best option, perfectly matched to the food and a veritable adventure in wine.

Bottom line – know before you Allowing guests to bring their go. Corkage isn't easy to suss out on websites. Best to call ahead. Thoughtfully select the bottle to bring. If appropriate, offer a taste to your wine server. And, lastly, always tip on the corkage.





GRATITUDE is an appreciation for what is received, focusing on what we have instead of what we lack. It is an attitude that affects our mental and emotional well-being that grows stronger with use and practice and is associated with greater happiness. Conversely, lack of gratitude tends to cause dissatisfaction, and a feeling that a person can't be happy until something lacking is obtained or happens. Studies have shown that people who purposely cultivate gratitude experience a myriad of benefits in physical, emotional and mental health.

Here are some creative ideas you and your loved ones can enjoy in November as we all work to unite in thankfulness as a community.

GRATITUDE TREE: Make a tree trunk, either 2D with paper on a poster, or 3D with a stick in a pot. Cut out different color leaves and place them in a bowl. Each day, pull out a leaf and write something you're thankful for and put it on the tree. Review the leaves each time you pass it, and read it aloud at Thanksgiving. **THANKFUL PROMPTS:** Write "I am thankful for" at the top of a page, and put prompts down the left side, then fill in the answer to the right of it. Include: things I see, hear, smell, touch, feel, taste; family member, friend, place, animal, memory, talent/skill, etc.

OPERATION APPRECIATION COMMUNICATION: Every day in November, communicate a message of appreciation to someone. Send a text, video message, thank you note, even say it in person at the store or wherever you are when someone is helpful.

APPRECIATION MEDITATION: Purposely schedule a window of time that you can turn all your devices off and meditate solely on all you're thankful for. Stumped on where to start? Consider a universe where you wake up tomorrow morning with only the things that you expressed appreciation for the day before, and see how fast your gratitude grows!

APPRECIATION ALPHABET: Draw a grid on a poster and put one letter of the alphabet in the upper corner of each square. Post it in a visible spot in your home with a pencil on a string attached. Throughout the day, as you and others pass by, write something you're grateful for in the square that starts with that letter. Bring the poster to Thanksgiving dinner and read it aloud.

GRATITUDE CHAIN: Cut links from construction paper and place in a bowl with a stapler next to it.

Encourage everyone to create a link a day by writing what they're grateful for on a piece, and adding it to the chain.

Use the chain as part of your Thanksgiving dinner décor so everyone can read it as you celebrate together.

HELPING HANDS: Have each member of your family trace both hands on paper. Each day, write something someone did that was helpful to you that day on one of the fingers, and then move onto the palms until the hands are covered with ways you've been helped by others. Consider a second set of mirror-image handprints that you daily write a way you helped someone else. These "helping hands" will bless you with gratitude, and foster gratitude in others as you help them.

GRATITUDE WALKABOUT: Take a walk outdoors (mountains, beach, trail, etc.) to connect with nature. Focus on every

little thing you see, smell, and feel all around you. Consider the magnificence of the glorious creations of this earth
